

Dr. Navin C. Nanda Honored as "Echocardiographer of the Millennium"



Dr. Navin C. Nanda was designated as the Echocardiographer of the Millennium by the Argentinean Society of Cardiology, October 2003. The Award was given to him during the 7th World Congress of Echocardiography and Vascular Ultrasound, October 10-12, 2003 held in Buenos Aires, Argentina in cooperation with XXX Argentine Congress of Cardiology. The Columbian Society of Cardiology also declared him the "Echocardiographer of the Millennium". This was presented to him during the XX Congress of the Colombian Society of Cardiology, November 21-22, 2003 held in Cartagena de Indias, Colombia. Both Awards recognized him for pioneering contributions to the development and expansion of echocardiography.

Dr. Jay Yadav to be honored by AACIO

It has been decided to honor Jay Yadav, M.D. at the AACIO meeting in March 2004. Dr. Yadav is Director of Vascular Intervention in the Department of Cardiovascular Medicine at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. He is an interventional cardiologist and neurologist, and has joint appointments in Cardiology, Neurology, and Vascular Medicine. Dr. Yadav did his Internal Medicine and Neurology residencies at Duke University and developed an interest in cerebrovascular intervention while a Chief Resident in Neurology at Duke University. He then completed training in Cardiology and Interventional Cardiology at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. He is recognized nationally and internationally as one of the pioneers and developers of carotid angioplasty and stenting.

Dr. Yadav's areas of research include cerebrovascular intervention and pharmacological and mechanical approaches to emboli prevention in cerebrovascular and coronary intervention. Dr.

Yadav's has over 100 publications and one book to his credit. He is the principal investigator or co-principal investigator of multiple interventional trials, including SAPPHIRE which is the first randomized trial comparing carotid stenting to carotid endarterectomy and utilizes an emboli protection device. AACIO is proud to honor Dr. Jay Yadav.

Dr. Keyur Parikh to receive American College of Cardiology 2004 International Service Award



Keyur Parikh, M.D., Director, Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory at Sterling Hospital in Ahmedabad, India has been selected by the International Committee and Board of Trustees of the American College of Cardiology to receive the prestigious 2004 International Service Award for his "commitment to medically developing or underdeveloped countries and for having provided a specific service to enhance cardiovascular care and/or education in these countries". He was chosen because of his dedication to "international causes" and he has been a "role model for others to follow in his footsteps." He will receive this award on March 9, 2004 during the Convocation Ceremony of the College's 53rd Annual Scientific Session in New Orleans, Louisiana. Dr. Parikh, who was born in Tanzania, graduated MBBS from Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College in Ahmedabad, India in 1980 and did his

Residency at the University of Southern California Medical Center and a Cardiovascular Fellowship at Kaiser Permanante Medical Center in Los Angeles, California. From 1987 to 1995 he practiced cardiology in Fremont and San Jose in northern California and was a Clinical Faculty Instructor at the Stanford University Medical Center. In 1995, he decided to return to India and set up a thriving practice in Ahmedabad, Gujarat where he is now permanently settled. While in India, he has conducted several CME programs for general physicians as well as teaching courses in interventional cardiology for cardiologists not only in Ahmedabad but also in other parts of the country. He has also actively participated in research projects in interventional cardiology in India and has several publications to his credit.

The abstracts of Dr. Nirat Beohar (Feinberg School of Medicine, Northwestern University, Chicago, Illinois) and Dr. Padmini Varadarajan (Division of Cardiology, Loma Linda University Medical Center, Loma Linda, California) were selected for the AACIO Young Investigator Award and were presented at the AACIO Meeting held during the AHA meeting in Orlando, Florida in November 2003. Both received a plaque and a check for \$1000.00. Dr. Beohar received the Dr. Krishna Ramaswamy Young Investigator's Award and presented an abstract on the "The Antirestenotic Effects of a Locally Delivered Caspase Inhibitor in a Balloon Injury Model"" and Dr. Varadarajan received the Dr. Madhukar Deshmukh Young Investigator's Award and presented his abstract on "Prognostic Importance of Hemoglobin in Congestive Heart Failure Patients with Normal Ejection Fraction: Results from a Cohort of 1079 Patients".

High Prevalence of Stroke in Asian Indians Living in this Country

A study published in the January 15, 2004 issue of the American Journal of Cardiology has found a high prevalence of stroke in Asian Indians living in the USA. A total of 1045 Asian Indians living in and around the Atlanta, Georgia metropolitan area were surveyed during religious and social gatherings at Bochasanwasi Shri Akshar Purushottam Swaminarayan Sanstha (BAPS) temple. The overall prevalence of stroke was found to be 2.77% which is much higher than in India where it has ranged from 0.22% to 0.63%. The prevalence rate of stroke was higher in older individuals, approaching 3.5% for those above the age of 45 years and 5.5% for subjects older than 60 years. Stroke was significantly associated with systemic hypertension, diabetes mellitus, coronary artery disease, end-stage renal disease and family history of stroke and myocardial infarction. There was no statistically significant difference in the prevalence of stroke between men and women and no association with hypercholesterolemia or obesity. The authors of the study were Drs. Gurpreet Baweja, Navin C. Nanda, and Rajesh Venkataraman from Birmingham, Alabama and Drs. Naresh Parikh and Vishal Bhatia from Atlanta, Georgia. There is paucity of data regarding the incidence of stroke in overseas Indians and this study is the first attempt to assess its prevalence and associated risk factors in Asian Indians living in the United States. Asian Indian immigrants currently number almost 2 million and are one of the fastest growing ethnic minorities in this country.
