

Srinivas Murali, MD, is a Professor of Medicine at the Drexel University College of Medicine, and Director, Division of Cardiovascular Medicine, and Medical Director, Gerald McGinnis Cardiovascular Institute at Allegheny General Hospital in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He graduated from the University of Madras in India in 1980, and completed his residency training in Internal Medicine and fellowship training in cardiovascular medicine at the Jewish Hospital and Medical Centre, New York in 1985. He moved to Allegheny General Hospital in 2006. In 2004, he was honoured as one of the "Best Heart Failure Specialists" by Business Week. Dr. Murali was recognized for his contributions to cardiovascular sciences by the World Congress of Clinical and Preventive Cardiology in 2008 and 2009. Over the past 24 years, he has authored or co-authored

He is initiating projects with the Indian government to promote "wellness" and prevention of heart disease in industrial workers covered by the government health insurance schemes.
