He was recognized for his pioneering contributions in not only pediatric but also fetal echocardiography. The article cited, "Dr. Navin Nanda has been involved in many of the biggest advances in the field of echocardiography over the last 50 years".
- Dr. Navin Nanda Echocardiographic and Vascular Training Academy established in the country of Philippines in honor of Dr. Navin Nanda has recently taken the inaugural class of students. The Academy was initiated by Dr. Arnold Pasia from Philippines who worked as a trainee under Dr. Navin Nanda. He also named his son who was born in Birmingham, Alabama during his training as Navin Pasia out of respect for Dr. Navin Nanda. Navin Pasia recently graduated in medicine in the Philippines.
- The third edition of his book titled "Comprehensive Textbook of Echocardiography (2 volumes)" with 5,637 illustrations and 1,852 movie clips was published this year by Jaypee Brothers Medical Publishers, New Delhi/London. It is probably the largest book in echocardiography.

.Dr. Vasanth Bethala, MD, FACC, FACP, FSCAI is an Interventional Cardiologist who is currently the Section Head of Ochsner Heart and Vascular Institute and Chair, Department of Cardiology, Slidell Memorial Ochsner Hospitals (SMH) in Slidell, Louisiana. Dr. Bethala graduated from Osmania University Medical College in Hyderabad. After training in internal medicine at Presbyterian - University of Pennsylvania and a fellowship in adult cardiology at Philadelphia Heart Institute, University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, he completed Interventional Cardiology training at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque.

He started his practice at Cardiology Institute in Slidell, Louisiana in 1992. As a founding member, he earned a reputation as a leading cardiologist and

forged strong relationships with hospital administration in caring for high-risk patients. He introduced various new innovative procedures to the community and has designed and developed several state-of-the-art programs that transformed cardiac care in the region.

He has served as Chief of Medical Staff and as Commissioner on the Board of Directors for Slidell Memorial Hospital and Louisiana Heart Hospital. As a founding member of the Medical Research Institute in Slidell, Dr. Bethala participated in nearly 300 multi-center clinical trials as Principal and Sub-Investigator in pharmaceutical and device development. He completed four fellowships, two at the University of Alabama in Birmingham (Echocardiography and Advanced Heart Failure/Transplant & Pulmonary Hypertension) and two at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center (General Cardiology and Interventional Cardiology). He has established himself as the top surgeon in this area and is very well respected by the local community. He has been in many leadership positions in the local community, among them are Chief of Staff and Board Director of Tulane Lakeview Regional Medical Center, Medical Director of Gulf South Medical Center and Clinical Assistant Professor of Surgery at Tulane Medical Center in New Orleans, Louisiana.

He graduated from Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal, Telangana, completed his MD at Osmania Medical College, and his DM in Cardiology at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal. He is a leader in Cardiology in India, has championed the *Know Your Heart* program, tobacco prevention campaigns, and large-scale CPR training for lay rescuers. A landmark contributions is the *WACAR* (*The Warangal Area Out-of-Hospital Cardiac Arrest Registry*), which was published in the *Indian Heart Journal* in 2020. This was India's very first registry on out-of-hospital cardiac arrest and it received the prestigious *Mendeley FAIRest Dataset Award*. His community

programs have received global recognition. The HEART (Health Education and Awareness in Rural Telangana) program on rural awareness and population screening was highlighted by the World Heart Federation.
